Nevada State Medical Association Appoints Edwin Kingsley, MD, President

Las Vegas – The Nevada State Medical Association appointed Edwin Kingsley, MD, a medical oncologist with Comprehensive Cancer Centers of Nevada, as its president.

Dr. Kingsley began his one-year term on April 28, having served as president-elect the previous year. As president, Dr. Kingsley represents more than 1,600 physicians and medical students who are members of the Nevada State Medical Association (NSMA). He is the Association's official spokesman during legislative or regulatory agency presentations, professional and public group presentations and for the media regarding issues affecting the practice of medicine. He will also lead the weekly NSMA Legislative Core Group meetings, and attend all six local and county medical society board meetings.

Prior to his new role, Dr. Kingsley served as president of the Clark County Medical Society during 2003-2004. He is a Magnum Cum Laude graduate and Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Utah, and received his medical degree from the University of Utah College of Medicine. He completed his internship and residency in internal medicine as well as his fellowship in hematology and oncology at the University of Arizona.

An accomplished musician, Dr. Kingsley founded Serenades of Life, a fund-raising concert for the Nathan Adelson Hospice in Las Vegas that features other Southern Nevada physician musicians.
